2. The Day of Confusion.

There is no confusion that His presence can't calm.

3. The Day of Resurrection.

"I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die; and whoever lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" (John 11:25–26)

There is no <u>death</u> that His <u>power</u> can't resurrect.

I want to know Christ and experience the mighty power that raised him from the dead. I want to suffer with him, sharing in his death, so that one way or another I will experience the resurrection from the dead! (Philippians 3:10–11, NLT)
